Hebrews 11:6 reads, "And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."

There are two important concepts we learn from this verse:

- (1) You cannot please God without faith.
- (2) Faith as our modus operandi consists in two fundamental concepts:
 - (a) We must believe in the existence of God.
 - (b) We must believe that He is also a rewarder of those who seek Him.

Point: Heb. 11:6 says that we are totally dependent on God for our existence, for our happiness, and for our security.

Application: For many Christians, the Christian life is devoid of God's power. Why?

Our best is not what God wants. He wants faith in His best--the Lord Jesus Christ -- His very own Son and the fullness of blessing He has made for us is in Him.

An Explanation of the Details of Faith The New Testament Word for Faith

The New Testament word for "faith" is $\pi \iota \sigma \tau \iota \zeta$.

It means a belief in someone or something *confidence, faith, trust, reliance on;* conviction of the truth or reality of anything.
