

**Faith then must always have a valid object**

Three things a valid object of faith must be or have:

- (1) It must be **ABLE and FREE** to save and provide for the one believing:

**Heb. 7:25; James 4:12; James 1:21**

- (2) (2) It must be **AVAILABLE** to save and provide for the one believing:

**Acts 17:26-27; Romans 8:34; Hebrews 7:25; 9:24; 13:5-6;**

- (3) (3) It must be **WILLING** to save and to provide for the one believing:

**John 3:16; Heb. 10:9-10; Phil. 2:6-8; 1 Tim. 2:4; 2 Pet. 3:9; Luke 19:10**

Faith, like the human mind, does not operate in a vacuum.

For faith to be **effective**, it must consistently have a valid object which includes the right content.

The Holy Spirit never contradicts the Word which He Himself inspired.

**Conclusions:**

Faith is personal with each individual

Biblical faith is not irrational, it is never blind faith
